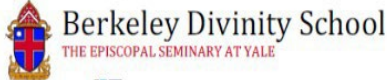

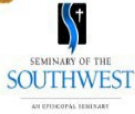

Most Episcopal seminaries offer three-year, part-time, and full-time graduate programs, for both ordained ministry and lay leadership, and offer advanced theological studies, master's degrees, doctor's degrees, and certificate programs for non-degree-seeking students.



The allocated amount is divided evenly between the seminaries each year. The maximum number per seminary is four.

The university bursar or other financial management staff members determine which seminarians receive grants.



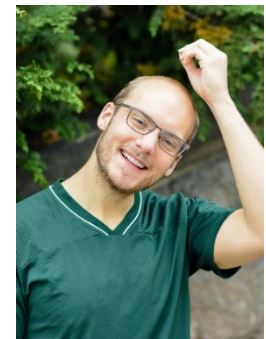

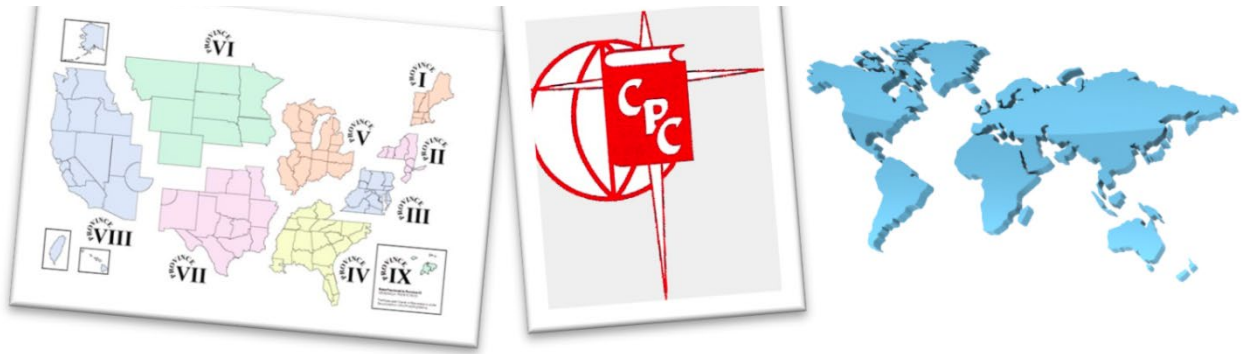

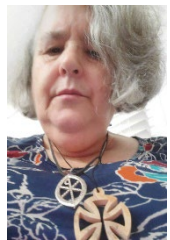

Communication is a combination of “com-” from the Latin word “with” and “-muni-” from “duty, service” and “-cation” from action or process. It occurs between two equals who are free to initiate and respond, or not. When recipients respond, the roles reverse.



The best communication occurs in person – physically present in the same space, on-line interaction, or a combination (“hybrid”). The most frequent second choice is visual communication. It may be in print, online, or both. It may or may not be interactive, and often isn’t. The third choice is audio; sending a messenger is the oldest, followed by the telegraph and telephone. Smartphones today combine audio and visual communication.

2023 NATIONAL BOOK FUND REQUESTS

What is the National Book Fund?

The NATIONAL BOOK FUND (NBF) is the fund within the Church Periodical Club that makes grants for written and electronic materials, both religious and secular, for adults. The NATIONAL BOOK FUND (NBF) money is donated by individuals, local churches, dioceses, and provinces. All CPC members and organizations are urged to make regular contributions or to sponsor specific grant requests. Grants are made once a year in June. The application deadline is **March 1** each year.

What can be covered?

Grants are made for written materials of all types, such as books, magazines, e-books, and workbooks. The specific materials are determined and purchased by the recipients. Materials may be religious or secular but must be used within the mission of the Church.

When can I apply?

Grant requests may be submitted at any time between March 2 and the March 1 deadline. They are reviewed and a determination is made whether to accept it, reject it as not eligible, or ask for more information. Submitting requests before the deadline is a kindness to the NBF committee.
