

FROM THE HISTORIAN, THE REV. JOHN CRIST:




I have worked on processing material that I have received and organizing into categories. Now I have moved to indexing our files. Our dog Shorty supervises and guards the workspace.

I bring you greetings.

I first one to apologized for the delay in responding to your email. The reason is at the time of your email communication, I have not bought all of the books. Secondly, the books were bought, but taking it to it destination had been the main cause of you not getting those documents you are requesting for.

It took a month plus few days before the books arrived at the school, that's about few days ago. We have a bad road network in this part of the country. Presently, the only means of fast transportation is motorbike that take you for over 14 to 16 hours to reach. We could not use motorbike to transportation the books because of the quantity. We used transportation truck to transport them and it took a month plus.

Finally, the books are here at the school, we are putting all of the required documents together for submission to your office. This will be done latest Wednesday.

Again, I'm sorry for the delay.

Mother Flemister knows what I'm talking about, she has worked in Liberia before and knows the conditions of our road.

May God bless all of you for the gift.

Miles of Pennies Grant Success – The PIMIL Council is very pleased to announce that our ministry was chosen to receive a grant from the Miles of Pennies program of the Church Periodical Club of the Episcopal Church. The grant is for \$840, which represents one mile of pennies laid end-to-end. We are very grateful for the Church Periodical Club's generosity.

Using the grant, PIMIL purchased 34 books for St. Paul's High School in Greenville, Sinoe County. The books were purchased from local vendors, including the Ministry of Education bookstore in Monrovia, and cover English, Math, Science, and Social Studies. Father John Sackie, principal of St. Paul's, was PIMIL's in-country point person for arranging for the purchase of the books and their transportation to the school. . . . The road from Monrovia to Greenville is horrendous, and it took the books a month to get to the school.

The partnership between these two entities was a blessing from the beginning. The thought of securing funding was obviously something that we needed as we dealt with a "blessed interruption" and the eventuality of coming back to in-person church. It was clear that NBF was worth pursuing knowing that it could be a wonderful collaboration to move us past covid-19 and the reopening of our doors. The resources that were available could certainly enhance our efforts to welcome our parishioners back together.

As a loving and faithful community in Richmond, VA, St. Philip's is one of the oldest churches in the Diocese of Virginia. We recently celebrated our 161st anniversary and focused on the theme of reflect, rejoice and renew. Receiving the church periodical fund grant helped us enhance that theme and respond to the preparation of our doors reopening and parishioners coming back to in person worship. We focused on the following areas of shared ministry.

- ♦ The Music Ministry
- † The Children's Ministry

- ♦ The Community Garden Ministry
- The Young Adult and Adult Ministry

Our worship team uses the music ministry to connect the liturgy, prayers and sermon. The children/young adults and adults ministry were more interested in non-traditional services. The community garden ministry offered open, safe space for services outdoors where many congregants felt more comfortable. It also produced nutritious vegetables needed for a healthy lifestyle. The positive effect of connecting and utilizing the collective efforts of those with like-minded ideas and goals brought our church family together to work on shared projects. As we returned to in-person church, it was important to ensure that St. Philip's continued to not just survive but also to thrive in our community.
