She was also a member of the Church of the Trinity in Nashville, a historic church downtown, and a Daughter of the King. She was also a skilled seamstress and quilter, sharing her needlework ministry generously.

Grant requests come from schools, libraries, agencies, dioceses, provinces and parishes throughout The Episcopal Church and Anglican Communion. Funds to cover the requests are donated by individuals, parishes, dioceses and provinces. Friends of CPC are encouraged to contribute regularly to the fund or to sponsor specific requests. Grants are made once a year in June. **The application deadline is March 1 each year.**

SEMINARIAN BOOK FUND

The total amount to be granted is determined at the annual meeting. Each Episcopal seminary in the United States receives an equal portion of the amount granted.

DIACONATE BOOK FUND

The total amount to be granted is determined at the annual meeting. Specific details about the fund will be added to the website when they are available.

The annual storage fee is \$100, covering up to five bankers boxes. The agreement runs for one year and may be renewed annually by mutual consent.

The contract has been signed. John took the archive boxes to Dekoven Center, and they are now safely stored.

Star Quilt from Province VI

Size: 96 x 96



Beth Agar was the sender. She states this quilt was a gift. It is a unique design. She showed it to her quilting shop expert, and she did not recognize it. It is long arm quilting and very intricate. The quilting is hard to see due to fabric colors. The front has 3 stars in corner. The quilting intricacies are easier to see on the back.



Here is Sue Haffke's reply:

I am so happy the quilt will help fund the Church Periodical Club. It has been several years since I made the quilt. The blocks were oversized then cut to skew the block for interest. Thank you for sharing where it went.

B. Crochet cozy blanket and bears from Province V

Size: 52 x40

This is an Afghan and three little bears - faith, hope and love. It is from an NBF recipient with a note"

"Thank you for getting us those books. I was told you raise money by selling quilts. I can't quilt but I hope this Afghan will help." I asked if I could use her name and location, but she declined. Bears are faith, hope and love. Maryfran will see if her office supply store has tags to put on each one.



C. Dominican quilts Province IX **Sizes:** Large quilt with pattern is 90x53; smaller one (pink and lavender) is 90 x 31; plans are to divide it into two lap quilts. The whole group might be bundled together.

There are two quilts. One is a print with a burgundy back. The other is pink and lavender and a cross stitch; it might be divided into two lap quilts. These are summer quilts as nothing heavy is used in the tropics.

The quilts are machine quilted on a multineedle quilting machine used for quilting fabric and mattress pads. These quilts would best be used as baby play areas or to cover furniture to protect it from children and pets.



They are fine to put in the dryer on low heat/delicate cycle. They would make a great gift for a family with young children, or to have in the car when traveling or to use for picnics, etc. The thread that is used is plastic and invisible on top. Amanda de la Cruz recommends washing on cool and **line drying** as thread may melt in the dryer or if



ironed.

Amanda de la Cruz included two magnets, one from Columbia and one from Rep Dominicana. She was able to bring them to the US when she came for Thanksgiving.

D. French table linen Province V Size: 60x 120

The yellow is a linen tablecloth never used from Nice France made at Tissus Torselli linens. The maker mark is on corner border. The company web site is tissustoselli.fr/en. They are known for Provençal fabrics and started in 1933

The border is olive branches. It was given to us as family moved mom to nursing home. They said she brought home awhile back for her trip but never used it.



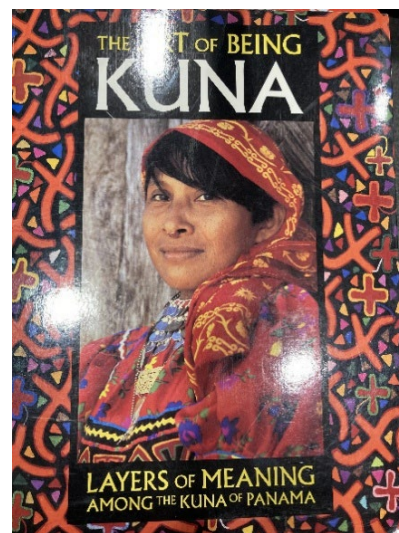
E. Leaf quilt Province V Size: 48 x 60



The leaf quilt is not hand made. It is a combination of appliques, hand sewing and machine work. From farm family in El Paso Illinois.

F. Molas Province V

These were purchased while ECW went to Honduras to support school Our Little Roses. While there the group painted and stenciled walls. Then they





brought back molas by the Punta Indians that persons could give a donation and use.



G. DOK quilt Province V

Size: 58x64

This quilt is being made by Susan O'Brien Past national president of the Order of the Daughters of the King® is making this quilt. She says she loves to quilt.



H. Farmer's Market quilt Province V Size: 41 x 57.

This was a gift from Farmers Market in Pontiac Il.

The farmers market near Maryfran Crist opened June 7. Shar, a quilt acquaintance, gave us this quilt. She names her quilts This is "All things bright and beautiful". It is a winter lap quilt Long arm stitched with fleece backing and washable cotton filler.



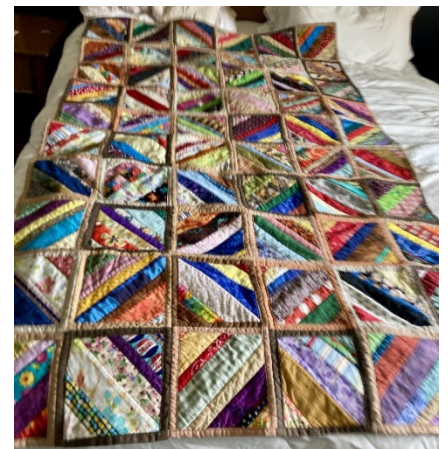
I. Province VIII quilt bright and flowers Size: 72 x 55

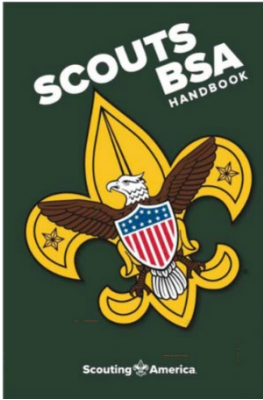
Note that it is made from scraps and so far Maryfran has only found 6 pieces that are the same. Happy hunting for matches.
